## **Bikes and Scooters**



#### New Home School Reading system:

Today, your child will bring home a leaflet explaining changes to our home school reading system. From now on, children can change their choosing books whenever they have read the books. The frequency of changing the books will be the decision of the parent. Moving the children from one 'book band' to another will also be the decision of the parent.

All bands of books are kept opposite the doors to the playground, in between year 2 and year 3. The boxes are labelled with the corresponding shape for the band of books. It is important that, when changing books, they are returned to the correct box.

Times for 'book change' will be daily: 8.40-8.50am or 3.15-3.30pm (Please make sure all children have been let out by their teachers before returning to school at the end of the day to change reading books.) Please see leaflet for further information.
