For health and safety reasons, no other jewellery please, including necklaces.

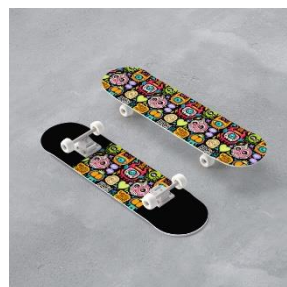
After School Activities

What are we learning in our classrooms this week?

We are exploring the story, 'The Three Billy Goats Gruff' and will be using describing words to make a wanted poster for The Troll!	In Literacy, we will be writing stories based on different pictures.	In Literacy, we will be learning about giant African land snails to write fact files.	In Literacy, we are using adverbs to express time, place and cause.	In Literacy, alongside our work on The Butterfly Lion, we will be revising our understanding of apostrophes.
We are consolidating our learning about 'one more' and 'one less' than a number.	In Numeracy, we are looking at how to calculate the mass of objects.	In Numeracy, we will be continuing to use money to calculate amounts and give change.	In Numeracy, we are multiplying and dividing by 3.	In Numeracy we are learning how to divide and multiply by 100 and 10.
In Science, we will be investigating which material would be the strongest to make a bridge out of for the Billy Goats to cross over.	In History, we are looking at the events that led up to the first moon landings.	In Design and Technology, we will begin our topic exploring wheels and axles.	In Computing, we are choosing commands to control our "sprites" (characters).	In History we are learning about the beliefs the Anglo-Saxons had and how they changed through that era.
