After School Computer Explorers Years 1 - 4

We are once again looking at the possibility of an after-school computer explorer club. Activities would include Programming, digital storytelling, animation, web design, coding, robotics, forensic science, video game design, music technology - the list is endless

The club would start in September with a cost of £9 per week, with parents paying for a half term block of lessons. Once payment has been made, there is no opportunity for a refund.

What are we learning in our classrooms this week?

In Literacy, we are reading the story 'Jasper's Beanstalk' and writing a sentence about what we might find at the top of a magical beanstalk.	In Literacy, we will be focusing on the suffixes: - ing, -ed, -er.	In Literacy, we will begin reading the book 'The Day the Crayons Quit.'	In Literacy, we are writing "Hunter-Gatherer" diary extracts. This links to our learning about the Stone Age in History.	In Literacy, we begin an exciting new Poetry Project that all Dorchester Year 4 classes will be taking part in this half term, finishing with a piece of writing to pass onto their new middle school teacher. The stimulus for our work will be a collection of poems about a boy finishing primary school and beginning secondary school from <i>The Final Year</i> by Matt Goodfellow.			
In Numeracy, we are learning some doubling facts up to 20.	In Numeracy, we will be looking at quarter turns, half turns and three quarter turns.	In Numeracy, we will be drawing and interpreting pictograms.	In Numeracy, we are adding and subtracting money.	In Numeracy, we will be looking at how you plot points on a grid.			
In Art, we are creating flower art using a range of different medias, including chalks, paint sticks, wax crayons and oil pastels.	In Art, we will be looking at the work of Henri Rousseau and creating our own jungle pictures.	In Computing, we will use the Scratch Junior software to create our own algorithms.	In History, we are learning about the Roman way of life, through evidence discovered at Pompeii.	In RE we will be looking at Hinduism and learning about what is important to them in their faith.
